ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA.

We, the undersigned, being citizens of the United States, and a majority being citizens of the District of Columbia, do hereby make and organize ourselves into a body corporate, under and by virtue of sub-chapter Three, chapter entitled Corporations of the Code of Law for the District of Columbia, as follows:

One. The name or title by which such Society shall be known is BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA.

Two: The term for which it is organized shall be perpetual.

Three: The particular business and objects of the Society are to organize the boys of the District of Columbia and elsewhere in the United States, into units, and to teach them, or cause them to be taught, through duly designated leaders, discipline, patriotism, courage, habits of observation and self control and ability to care for themselves in all exigencies of life.

Fourth. The managers for the first year of their existence shall be eleven in number.
